Recommended Electives for the BHS in CSD – these courses are not required but are suggested electives.

- Manual Communication 1 – CSD 1110 (3) (A course in manual communication may be a requirement for some graduate programs in SLP or Audiology. This course cannot be taken for credit after ASL I.)
- Research Apprenticeship – CSD 4950 (1-3) (Students work with CSD professors on research projects. The research apprenticeship is typically reserved for students who are juniors or seniors.)
- Clinical Apprenticeship in CSD – CSD 4945 (1-3)
[Open to seniors only. This enrollment allows students to gain experience in the Audiology Clinic (following Intro to Audiology), the Robert G. Combs Language Preschool, or the Accent Modification and Pronunciation Program. Students may apply to begin working in the Preschool as early as the summer session preceding their senior year.]

To Declare a Minor or Double-Major in another area, students must contact the department in which they are seeking a minor/double-major for advising. All “declaration of minor” forms must be submitted to the CSD department before graduation.

All MU students must complete 120 college-level credit hours for a baccalaureate degree. Students in the CSD department must apply to be accepted to the BHS program during the spring semester of their sophomore year, or after they have completed 42 college-level credit hours. See “Policy Statement” for admission requirements. Junior- and senior-level courses are only open to students who have been admitted to the BHS program in Communication Science and Disorders or who have received special permission. *All CSD majors must meet with an advisor in the CSD department to determine appropriate course schedules and acceptance of transfer credit. Pre-professional advising will be conducted by the CSD advisor in the SHP Student Affairs Office. Once a student is admitted to the BHS program, s/he will be assigned a faculty advisor in the Department.*
